Orff lesson plan format

Grade level: 4th grade

<u>Concept/Curriculum Goal:</u> Students will practice 8th note/2-16th notes and 2-16th notes/8th note rhythms through words and improvisations and performance.

Materials:

PowerPoint slides for lesson

Barred instruments

"Way Down South" from Recorder Routes I.

Outline:

I. Opening/Introduction:

Start with words for Way Down South on board. Read poem. Have students read it with you. Have students clap the rhythm to the words.

II. Presentation:

Put rhythm for poem on board. Look, it's the same rhythm that we talked about last time. Have students go to Orff instruments and take off BFFs using two hands. Have students play the rhythm for line 1 on one note of choice on Orff instruments. Pick a different note for line 2 and play it. Same for line 3 and 4.

III. Exploration:

Have students improvise using the rhythm of the poem. Have them do it again except this time tell them the must end on do. Have students play their improvisation.

Show elephant and grasshopper pictures. Have students come up with phrase for picture and use it as rhythm for an improvisation. Have each student play their improvisation.

IV. Culmination/Closing:

Have students decide the order for performance (speak poem, play poem improvisations and picture improvisations). Perform!
